

History of Apex Arena Solutions

Apex Arena Solutions was founded in 2012 as a result of our ownership team growing tired of the way Energy Service Companies delivered renewable energy and energy efficiency projects. Our new business model has changed the way our projects are developed, marketed, and delivered.

Apex Arena Solutions was incorporated as a Minnesota Public Benefit Corporation on January 2, 2015.

Apex's goal is to improve the environment by upgrading the energy efficiency of buildings, reducing both the carbon emissions and pollution that is released to the environment from these facilities. The company also serves the less fortunate by helping alleviate poverty, improving educational opportunities, providing housing and addressing the exploitation of children.

Pursuit of our Mission

Regarding the period covered by this report, January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016, Apex Arena Solutions pursued the specific benefit purpose stated in its articles of incorporation in the following ways.

Apex Arena Solutions works with ice arenas to improve their energy efficiency. We do that by identifying potential energy saving opportunities, and then working with them to quantify the costs and savings associated with those opportunities, ultimately implementing them and then providing measurement and verification of the actual savings achieved.

We believe that Apex Facility Solutions was successful in achieving the goals of our specific benefit purpose in the following ways.

In the projects completed with our clients in 2016, we saved them 1.2 Million kWh of electricity. These projects were completed at various times throughout the year. We are only reporting on the environmental impact that was achieved at the completion of the project through the end of the year. When we add those projects to the past projects our company has completed for our clients, the total energy savings for the year were over 7.9 Million kWh of electricity and over 147,600 Therms of natural gas. According to the EPA, this equates to over 6,244 metric tons of CO2 reduction.

As one of the first Specific Benefit Corporations in Minnesota, we strive to alleviate poverty and homelessness, as well as improve education opportunities and address the exploitation of children. We tithe corporate profits into the Apex Foundation to assist with this mission.

It is our goal at Apex to continuously improve the world through the implementation of fiscally-responsible and environmentally-friendly projects. Plus, we actively work to improve the community around us and abroad by dedicating a portion of each year's profits to these causes. Half of Apex Foundation's assets are used to help in the local community. The other half of the assets are used globally to help fight poverty and injustice.

In 2016, Apex had sent 7 people on trips to work in Haiti. Each person worked in the community of Williamson for one week. In February 2016, we sent 6 people to Haiti to finish the construction of a chicken coop which is currently being used to raise broiler chickens, providing employment for local Haitians as well as revenue to help fund a local school that has over 450 children enrolled. Those on the trip also helped build a community shower at the site of the well that was dug during our June 2015 trip, taught sewing classes to the Haitian women to give them the opportunity to learn a skill that could provide income for their families, painted a beautiful mural on the wall of the school and built a memorial site (grave) for one of the Haitian workers who was involved in a fatal accident late 2015.

In April 2016, we sent one individual down to Haiti to work in Williamson for one week. While there this individual helped to build a shed to keep the Haitian workers, who control the use of the well pump we installed in 2015, out of the heat of the sun. This individual also helped to build a fence for agricultural use and teach a women's health class to the local women in Williamson and City on a Hill.

Apex Efficiency Solutions tithed \$64,544 of their corporate profits into the Apex Foundation. The actual expenses for sending the people to Haiti to do the actual work that is described above, was in addition to the tithe.
